About the Webinar:

The professionalization of sports coaches brings new challenges and demands for 21st century coaches whose work can be considered unique and highly individualized. Within the context of rapidly changing social conditions in developing societies, sports coach education is central to develop, sustain and increase participation in sport. The traditional approaches to coach teaching and learning that view learning as a simple process of internalising a fixed body of knowledge have become outdated and ineffective. The traditional emphasis on content, or what we feel our students should learn, has become less important than the need to help them learn how to learn and to think critically about both content and process of a sport or game. In order for the field to grow, and to improve sports coaching, it is important that discuss the evidences of effective curriculum and practice and areas of improvement within formal sports coach education.

The Institute conducts some regular and periodic sports education programmes viz. **Diploma in Sports Coaching, M.Sc. in Sports Coaching, Certificate Course in Sports Coaching and several Skill Development Courses.**
