1. NATIONAL SPORTS UNIVERSITY AT A GLANCE

1.1 INTRODUCTION

National Sports University (NSU), a Central University is the first of its kind in India located in Manipur. The University was established by an Act of Parliament in the year 2018. Hon'ble Prime Minister of India Shri Narendra Modi laid the foundation stone of National Sports University on 16th March 2018. NSU is envisioned with the aim to promote Sports Education in the area of Sports Sciences, Sports Technology, Sports Management and Sports Coaching besides functioning as the National Training Center for selected sports disciplines by adopting best international practices. Presently, the University is functioning from a temporary campus at Khuman Lampak Sports Complex, Imphal, while the permanent campus is under construction at Imphal West spreading over an area of 325.90 acres of land.

Although in nascent stage, the University is moving forward in the direction of becoming a world-class university. NSU has also collaborated with other foreign Universities – viz. University of Canberra, Australia, Victoria University, Australia and Russian International Olympic University, Russia to fulfill the growing requirement of human resources, facilitate advance research in the field of sports education, research and training.

The National Sports University has the flexibility of opening new Schools / Departments in accordance with the advancement and developments in sports sciences, sports medicine, and other allied areas.

1.2 VISION

1.3 MISSION

Achieving excellence in sports through education, research and training.

1.4 OBJECTIVES

To promote sports education in the areas of sports sciences, sports technology, sports management and sports coaching besides functioning as the national training center for selected sports disciplines by adopting best international practices.

1.5 KEY FUNCTIONS

The National Sports University has distinctive approach to academics, research, sports performance and extension services, which sets the university apart from the other universities or institutions of higher education in the field of Sports.

i. Academics: National Sports University imparts Undergraduate and Postgraduate programmes in Sports Coaching, Sports Sciences and Physical Education. The University intends to start Doctoral programmes in Physical Education, Coach Education, Sports Psychology, Sports Nutrition and Exercise Physiology. The University shall also impart programmes in Sports Medicine, Sports Management &

Technology, Sports Sociology, Language, Peace and Development. Other specialized degree programmes in various disciplines of Sports Education and Coaching are also envisaged in the University's Road map.

ii. Research: The University focuses on collaborating with leading researchers within and outside the country to undertake pioneering research programmes and exchange information in various research areas, particularly in the field of Sports Sciences, Sports Coaching, Physical Education, Sports Management etc. for performance enhancement of athletes.

iii. Performance: One of the significant functions of the University is to serve as Centre of Excellence for the Elite and other talented sportspersons to enhance their performance and attain excellence in sports.

iv. Serving the Community: The University provides extension services to the local community with the objectives of improving their health and lifestyle besides giving impetus to traditional sports like Sagol Kangjei (polo), Thang- Ta (Manipuri Martial Art), Yubi Lakpi (rugby), Mukna Kangjai, Mallakhamb, Kabaddi, etc.

1.6 PARTNERS

NSU has established partnership with national and international institutions/ universities to synergize its efforts and establish new benchmarks for enhancing quality. These partnerships shall secure inputs from a larger pool of expertise and provide better access to other resources which, in turn, may benefit NSU in the conduct of advanced research, imparting innovative education and introducing the latest training techniques in the field of sports coaching.

National Partners: The national partners of NSU viz. - Sports Authority of India, National Sports Federations, Sports Associations, Sports Institutions, etc. is working closely to provide NSU robust inputs on various aspects of sports education, sports coaching and to develop the University into a Centre of Excellence.

International Partners: In addition to forging partnerships with National Institutions, partnerships shall be sought with more foreign Universities to bring in specific expertise and to ensure achievement of high performance in sports. The bilateral collaboration would enable NSU to expand beyond the geographical boundaries of India and have a global impact.

1.7 CAMPUS

1.7.1 Temporary Campus

The National Sports University is currently functioning from Khuman Lampak Sports Complex, Imphal. The campus is about 10 kilometers away from the Imphal Airport and 1 kilometer away from the Imphal City and the ISBT.

1.7.2 Permanent Campus

The permanent campus of National Sports University has a sprawling area of 325.90 acres of land. It is located at Imphal West which is about 21 kilometers from the Imphal City and Imphal Airport while 22

kilometers away from ISBT. The construction work in the permanent campus is in full swing and will soon be functional.

1.8 CO-CURRICULAR AND EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

The University promotes co-curricular and extra-curricular activities for a holistic development of the students.

Co-curricular activities like the NCC, Educational Tours, Leadership Training Camps, Outreach Activities, Adventure Camps, etc. are undertaken along with curricular activities to enable the students learn the art of living and working together. Various extra-curricular activities like dramatics, music, debates, symposia, quiz competitions, youth festivals, etc. are undertaken to promote intellectual, emotional, and moral growth of students.

1.9 SCHOLARSHIPS

National Sports University award scholarships to meritorious undergraduate and postgraduate students to promote and recognize academic and sports excellence. Scholarships shall be awarded based on the recommendation of the University Scholarship Committee (USC) and on approval of the Vice-Chancellor.

2.1 POSTGRADUATE PROGRAMMES

2.1.1 MASTER OF SCIENCE IN SPORTS COACHING [M.Sc. (SC)]

The postgraduate programme in Sports Coaching provides advanced training in coaching theory, methods, and ethics through both course work and independent research. It aims to provide students with an opportunity to learn and develop their coaching skills and prepare them for the world of professional coaching.

Duration: 2 years

Semester: 4 Semesters

Eligibility:

Essential:

- Any individual who possesses an Under-graduate Degree with PG Diploma/Diploma in Sports Coaching or B.P.Ed. / B.P.E.S. / B.Sc. (SC) (3 Years) with PG Diploma/ Diploma in Sports Coaching or B.Sc. (SC) (4 Years) or equivalent.
- 50% marks in qualifying examination for Unreserved (UR), OBC (Non-Creamy Layer), Economically Weaker Sections (EWS) Kashmiri Migrants & Kashmiri Pandits/Kashmiri Hindu Families (Non-Migrants) living in Kashmir valley.
- 45% marks in qualifying examination for SC/ST.

Desirable:

Sports Participation: National or All India Inter-University.

Sports Discipline Offered: Athletics, Archery, Badminton, Boxing, Football, Shooting, Swimming, and Weightlifting.

2.1.2 MASTER OF ARTS IN SPORTS PSYCHOLOGY [M.A. (SP)]

The programme's philosophy aims to critically engage the students with a wide range of Sport Psychology perspectives by relying on a variety of research and applied approaches. The student will study on the influence of research and psychology theory on practical. The curriculum concentrates on important areas in the practical settings of sport, while giving a critical awareness of sports psychology with the goal of preparing students for practitioner or doctoral research and academic careers in sports psychology. The curriculum also focuses on the psychological factors that impact human performance, evaluation and intervention procedures that improve an individual's performance and personal development.

Duration: 2 years

Semester: 4 Semesters

Eligibility:

Essential:

- Any individual who possesses B.P.Ed./B.A. (Honours) in Psychology/B.P.E.S./B.Sc. (SC) or any other Under-graduate Degree with Psychology/Sports Psychology as one of the subjects.
- 50% marks in qualifying examination for UR (Unreserved), OBC (Non-Creamy Layer), Economically Weaker Sections (EWS), Kashmiri Migrants & Kashmiri Pandit/Kashmiri Hindu Families (Non-Migrants) living in Kashmir valley.
- 45% marks in qualifying examination for SC/ST.

Desirable:

Participation in any Sports or Games.

Career Outcome: Postgraduates of this programme can aspire to work as:

- Sports Psychologist with National and/or international athletes.
- Counsellor in sports and clinical fields.
- Private practitioner in Sports Psychology.
- Academician in different sports universities in India.

2.1.3 MASTER OF SCIENCE IN APPLIED SPORTS NUTRITION [M.Sc. (ASN)]

Sports Nutrition as an area of specialization in higher education has gained particular interest in India in recent times, and has since been recognized as an important part of achieving optimal athletic performance. This is a culmination of decades of sports science services and support rendered to Indian Athletes, with minimal capacity building in this super specialization. Hence, the two-year M.Sc. (Applied Sports Nutrition) is being initiated by the National Sports University, Manipur, under the aegis of MYAS to fill this gap. This course will be first of its kind and has been rigorously compiled to translate the existing scientific understanding of sports nutrition into on-field day-to-day monitoring of training and performance of athletes.

The M.Sc. (Applied Sports Nutrition) programme will follow the Choice Based Credit System as per the guidelines issued by the UGC and **the first-of-its programme to implement the National Education Policy, 2020 (NEP) with multiple entry-exit points and flexibility for inclusion of online courses and credit transfer options in the country.**

Duration: 2 years
Semester: 4 Semesters

Exit Option: Students have an option/ choice to exit the course after 1 Year (2-Semesters) with a PG Diploma in “Sports Nutrition”.

Eligibility: **Essential:**

- Any individual who possesses an under-graduate degree in the following discipline(s):
 - Nutrition/ Food & Nutrition/ Applied Nutrition/Nutrition & Dietetics/Home Science/ Food Science/Applied Nutrition & Public Health, Clinical Nutrition & Dietetics, or an Equivalent Degree.
 - Sports Science/Exercise/Human or Medical Physiology/ Biochemistry/ Zoology.
 - Bachelor of Ayurvedic Medical Science (BAMS)
 - Bachelor of Physical Education and Sports (BPES) or Bachelor of Sports Coaching (BSC) with Sports Nutrition as one of the courses in the programme.
- 50% marks in qualifying examination for UR (Unreserved), OBC (Non-Creamy Layer), Economically Weaker Sections (EWS), Kashmiri Migrants & Kashmiri Pandit/Kashmiri Hindu Families (Non-Migrants) living in Kashmir valley.
- 45% marks in qualifying examination for SC/ST.

2.1.4 MASTER OF PHYSICAL EDUCATION AND SPORTS (M.P.E.S)

Duration: 2 years

Semester: 4 Semesters

Eligibility:

Essential:

- The candidate must have passed the Bachelor of Physical Education and Sports (B.P.E.S.) or any other equivalent examination recognized by the Government.
- 50% marks in the qualifying examination for UR (Unreserved), OBC (Non-Creamy Layer), Economically Weaker Sections (EWS), Kashmiri Migrants & Kashmiri Pandit/Kashmiri Hindu Families (Non-Migrants) living in Kashmir valley.
- 45% marks in the qualifying examination for SC/ST.

- Teachers/Assistant Professors in Sports Colleges/Universities/Departments
- Sports Administrator in Universities and Colleges
- Sports Officers in Directorate of Youth Affairs and Sports

- Sports Therapists

The postgraduate programme in Physical Education and Sports is rigorously designed and intellectually demanding professional education. This course will also provide the advance knowledge and research training required for higher degrees of research such as doctoral programmes.

The programme helps to chalk out pathway to becoming an innovator in the exciting world of physical education and sports.

2.2 UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMMES

2.2.1 BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN SPORTS COACHING [B.Sc. (SC)]

B.Sc. [SC] focuses on coaching methods and theories among other aspects like sports pedagogy, sports sciences, skills technique, tactics, etc. The programme will help the students develop a unique combination of skills, knowledge, and expertise in Sports Coaching.

Duration: 4 years

Semester: 8 Semesters

Eligibility:

Essential:

- The Candidate must have passed 12th standard or any other equivalent examination recognized by the Government.
- 45% marks in the qualifying examination for UR (Unreserved), Economically Weaker Section (EWS), OBC (Non-Creamy Layer), Kashmiri Migrants & Kashmiri Pandit/ Kashmiri Hindu Families (Non-Migrants) living in Kashmir valley.
- 40% marks in the qualifying examination for SC/ST.
- The candidate must have participated in state level / regional or zonal level competitions organized by School Games Federation of India (SGFI)/ State Associations/ National Sports Federations recognized by Indian Olympic Association in the sports disciplines offered by NSU.

Sports Discipline Offered: Archery, Athletics, Badminton, Boxing, Football, Shooting, Swimming and Weightlifting.

Note: The sports discipline of the candidate will be fixed based on his/her sports achievements.

A candidate shall choose a game/sports he/she intend to specialize from the sports discipline and shall not be permitted to change the game/ sports once he/she is admitted.

2.2.2 BACHELOR OF PHYSICAL EDUCATION AND SPORTS (B.P.E.S)

B.P.E.S is designed for students to gain specialized knowledge in the areas of physical education and sports. The programme helps the candidate chalk out pathways to become an innovator in the exciting world of physical education and sports.

Duration: 3 years

Semester: 6 Semesters

Eligibility:

Essential:

- The Candidate must have passed the 12th standard scheme of examination or any other equivalent examination recognized by the Government.
- 45% marks in the qualifying examination for UR (Unreserved), Economically Weaker Sections (EWS), OBC (Non-creamy layer), Kashmiri Migrants & Kashmiri Pandit/Kashmiri Hindu Families (Non-Migrants) living in Kashmir valley.
- 40% marks in the qualifying examination for SC/ST.

Career Outcome: Graduates in Physical Education and Sports can aspire to work in:

- Sports administration
- Fitness club
- Health clubs
- Hospitality industry
- Educational institutions

4. ADMISSION RULES

4.1 The Admission Rules as framed by the University from time to time and shall be applicable for all admissions. All decisions taken by the University in this regard shall be final. The candidates are advised to go through the instructions given in the 'Admission Application Form' as well as in the Prospectus before submission of application.

4.2 Minimum of 5 students is required for the commencement of any Undergraduate and Postgraduate programmes. Any programme will not be offered in the absence of 5 students. Fee taken from any students for the programme will be refunded to the student.

4.3 Age Limit:

- i. The minimum age limit for B.Sc. (SC) and B.P.E.S. programme is 17 years as of 1st July 2023.
- ii. The upper age limit for seeking admission to B. Sc. (SC) is 25 years and BPES is 23 years as of 1st July 2023.
- iii. Relaxation in age shall be as per the Government of India Rules.
- iv. The Competent Authority may relax the minimum age criterion at his/her discretion.
- v. There is no age bar for Postgraduate programme.

4.4 Medical Fitness Certificate: Candidate must produce a Medical Fitness Certificate, as per the ANNEXURE-G, approved by a Government Medical Officer to undergo Physical Fitness Test at the test centres.

4.5 Merely appearing in National Sports University NSUEE does not confer any right to the candidate for admission to the University. Selection and admission to NSU are subject to fulfilling the Admission Criteria, Eligibility, Rank in Merit List, Medical Fitness, Verification of Original Documents and such other criteria as may be prescribed by the University.

4.6 RESERVATION POLICY

For admission to any programme offered by NSU, the reservation policy given below as per the Reservation Policy of the Government of India shall be applicable.

- i. The benefit of reservation for admission to National Sports University shall be as per Govt. of India Reservation Policies and on production of the relevant documents at the time of verification of documents.
- ii. Other Backward Classes - Non-Creamy Layer (OBC–NCL) are as per the Central list of Other Backward Class available on National Commission for Backward Classes (NCBC), Government of India website (www.ncbc.nic.in) are eligible for reservation under this category.
- iii. Economically Weaker Section (EWS) - This provision would be regulated as per the OM No.20013/01/2018-BC-II dated 17 January 2019 issued by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment and the OM No. 12-4/2019-U1 dated 17.01.2019 and Letters No 35-2/2019-T.S.I dated 21/01/2019, 01/02/2019, 04/02/2019 and 15/02/2019 of Ministry of Education, Department of Higher Education.
- iv. One seat each for Postgraduate Programmes (supernumerary) and two seats for Undergraduate Programmes (supernumerary) are provided for registered Kashmiri Migrants. Candidates registered with different State Government should produce proof of registration in original at the time of Counselling to NSU.
- v. If a candidate claims that he/she belongs to a reserved category in the Admission Application Form but fails to submit documents supporting the claim to the satisfaction of the University at the time of admission, then his/her Provisional Selection to that category shall stand cancelled automatically.

4.7 WOMEN CANDIDATES

- i. 30% of seats are reserved for women candidates, however if the seats do not get filled, male students would be admitted.
- ii. Married girl is eligible for admission.
- iii. In the case of married student conceiving during the course shall render her discontinuation from the course for at least one academic year.
- iv. She may re-join the same course afresh from the beginning of the semester she had discontinued her studies, provided the University guidelines pertaining to the maximum duration of the course is adhered to.
- v. Under no circumstances she will be permitted to keep the infant along with her in the Hostel.

4.8 DIRECT ADMISSION FOR INTERNATIONAL ATHLETES AND NATIONAL MEDALISTS

- i. International athletes are eligible for Direct Admission to all the Undergraduate and Postgraduate programmes offered by NSU provided that they have participated in Olympic Games, Asian Games, Commonwealth Games, South Asian Games, Youth Olympics, Commonwealth Youth Games, Asian Youth Games, World Championships, Asian Championships, and Commonwealth Championships in the disciplines included in Olympic Games, Asian Games, and Commonwealth Games, provided they fulfill the minimum educational eligibility criteria.
- ii. Medalists at Junior and Senior National Championships organized by National Sports Federations recognized by MYAS, IOC are eligible for direct admission to all the UG and PG programmes provided they fulfill the minimum educational eligibility criteria.
- iii. All such candidates who wish to be considered for direct admission shall mandatorily fill the application form available at www.nsu.ac.in and upload all the documents along with the Sports Participation Certificate.
- iv. Selected candidates shall represent NSU in the game in which he/she has received direct admission.

4.9 FOREIGN NATIONALS AND NRI CANDIDATES

Foreign candidates should apply through Proper Channels / Diplomatic Channels i.e. through the concerned Embassy or Indian Council for Cultural Relations. Admission would be on the basis of their credentials; eligibility, attainment of minimum qualifying marks in admission test, Rank in Merit List, Medical Fitness, Verification of Original Documents and such other criteria as may be prescribed by the University. At the time of admission NOC from the respective Embassy should be submitted.

4.10 FEE STRUCTURE

Fee structure for Indian and foreign students for Undergraduate programme and Postgraduate programme is given from Annexure – I to L.

5. ADMISSION PROCESS

5.1 APPLICATION FOR ADMISSION

5.1.1 Application Form: Application for the admission shall be available online on the website of NSU, www.nsu.ac.in. Candidates may apply for NSUEE 2023 in “Online” Mode ONLY by accessing the NSU website www.nsu.ac.in. Application Form other than the online mode would not be accepted.

5.1.2 Multiple Applications: If any candidate is applying for more than one Course, they should register separately using a separate E-mail ID & phone number and submit the application form.

- a. Candidates applying for B.Sc. (SC) and BPES will have a common entrance examination.
- b. Candidates applying for PG courses will have to appear for separate examination for the courses which he/she has applied for.

5.1.3 Eligibility to Apply: A candidate, who wishes to apply for any of the programmes offered by NSU, should read the eligibility criteria and general conditions for admission and satisfy himself / herself about his / her eligibility to apply. Eligibility criteria for each course are given in the points 2.1.1, 2.1.2, 2.1.3, 2.2.1 and 2.2.2 of the Prospectus.

5.1.4 Provisional Application: If the candidate is appearing in a qualifying examination and the result thereof is awaited, he/she can apply. However, admission will be subject to meeting the eligibility criteria on the date of admission.

5.1.5 Online Application Fee: The online application fee is Rs. 1000/- per course. However, if the candidate desires to apply for another programme (provided the required eligibility criteria are fulfilled), he/she should pay the fee separately for the new programme and submit separate Application Form. The Online Application Fee shall not be reimbursed under any circumstances.

- d) Proof of Identity (Aadhaar/Identity Card)- (file size: less than 20kb)
- e) Proof of Date of Birth (Matriculation/Birth Certificate). (file size: less than 20kb)
- f) Reserved Category Certificate, if applicable (file size: less than 200 kb).
- g) Sports Participation/Achievement Certificate in the last five years, if applicable (file size: less than 200 kb).

Step-3: Click on Submit.

Step-4: Pay the Fee using the Payment Gateway(s) integrated to the Online Application through Net Banking / Debit / Credit Card / UPI / Wallet/ Paytm and keep proof of fee paid.

Note: All 4 Steps can be done together or at separate timing.

Step-5: After successful completion of **Step - 4**, the Confirmation Page of the Application Form, should be downloaded, and a printout of the same may be retained for future reference. The Confirmation Page of the online Application Form could be generated only after successful payment of fees by the Candidate.

The candidates are advised to read the instructions given in the Admit Card carefully in advance and follow the instructions during the examination. In case a candidate is unable to download Admit Card from the website, he/she may approach the Helpline number 0385-2421004/+917641813618 between **10:00 A.M.** and **5:00 P.M.** or write to NSU at nsuadmissionsoff@gmail.com.

In case of any discrepancy in the particulars of the candidate or his/her photograph or signatures shown in the admit card and confirmation page, the candidate may approach the Helpline numbers 0385-2421004/+917641813618 between **10:00 A.M.** and **5:00 P.M.** in advance before the schedule date of examination. In such cases candidates would appear in the Examination with the already downloaded Admit Card.

Note:

- i. Candidate may please note that Admit Cards will not be sent by post.
- ii. Candidate must not mutilate the Admit Card or change any entry made therein.
- iii. Candidates are advised to preserve their Admit Cards in good condition for future reference.
- iv. Admit Card shall be issued only to the eligible candidates.

8.5 The entire application process for NSUEE 2023 is online, including uploading of scanned images, payment of fees, and printing of confirmation page, admit card, etc. Therefore, candidates are not required to send/submit any hard copy of the document(s) to NSU through Post/Fax/WhatsApp/ Email/by Hand.

8.6 In case it is found at any time in future that the candidate has used/uploaded the photograph and signature of someone else in his/ her Application Form/Admit Card or he/she has tampered his/her Admit

Card/result, these acts of the candidate shall be treated as Unfair Means (UFM) practices on his/ her part and he/she shall be proceeded with the actions as decided by the Admission Committee.

8.7 Declaration of Results for NSUEE 2023

- i. The result of NSUEE 2023 will be announced in the University website <http://nsu.ac.in/>.
- ii. After the declaration of results, the University will conduct Medical Fitness Test and Counselling at Imphal Centre for admission to Undergraduate and Postgraduate Programmes.
- iii. There is no provision for rechecking/re-evaluation/re-totaling of the result/score, and no query in this regard will be entertained.

8.8 Merit List

All India merit lists shall be prepared on the basis of the following:

8.8.1 Undergraduate Programmes:

Merit list will be based on the score obtained in written examination, physical fitness test, game proficiency, sports achievement/participation certificates.

8.8.2 Postgraduate Programmes:

- i. M.Sc. (SC) and M.P.E.S.** Merit list will be based on the score obtained in written examination, physical fitness test, game proficiency, sports achievement/participation certificate and viva-voce.
- ii. M.A. (SP).** Merit list will be based on the score obtained in the written examination, sports achievement/participation certificate and viva-voce.
- iii. M.Sc. (ASN).** Merit list be based on the score obtained in the written examination, sports achievement/working experience in sports and viva-voce.

Note: NSU reserves the right to change the minimum qualifying marks on the recommendation of the Admission Committee.

8.9 Medical Fitness Test: After the result of the Admission Test is declared, the selected candidates shall undergo a detailed Medical Fitness Test conducted by a board of medical doctors constituted by NSU at Imphal.

8.11 Counselling: Selected candidates based on merit list and Medical Fitness Test will be called for original document verification and counselling. Candidates must bring all the original documents along with one set of photocopies to NSU, Imphal for verification.

8.12 Payment of Fees: Selected candidate shall pay tuition and hostel fee through online mode only after they are notified.

10.1 Medium of NSUEE: The medium of NSUEE shall be English for all the courses.

10.2 Character of the Candidate: Candidates expelled from any other Board/ Institute/University or dismissed from Government service on disciplinary grounds and those who are known to have been involved in acts of crime and gross indiscipline or misconduct will not be eligible for admission. The University may approach the police for verification in this regard. After admission, at any time of the on-going programme, if a student is found guilty in this regard, his/her admission will be cancelled without any notice.

10.3 Furnishing False Information: Admission will be granted to the candidates at their own risk and responsibility as per details furnished by them. If, at any time, it is noticed that the admission has been obtained by giving incorrect or false information or concealing information or oversight, the admission granted will be cancelled and the candidate shall be asked to leave the University.

10.4 Submission of Mandatory Documents: Once the counselling is over and the candidate is selected for a programme, he/she shall, at the time of securing admission, within the time stipulated for the purpose, submit self-attested copies of the following mandatory documents along with the original documents for verification:

- i. Certificate/Marksheet of the qualifying examination.
- ii. Proof of date of birth - Marksheet of Secondary / Senior Secondary Examination.
- iii. Character/Conduct Certificate from the Institute/College/University last attended.
- iv. Bonafide Certificate testifying the candidate's SC/ST/OBC status, if applicable, in the prescribed format as given in ANNEXURES- C & D.
- v. Candidates claiming reservation in the OBC Category are to submit a Declaration regarding Non-creamy Layer in the prescribed format specified in ANNEXURE-E.
- vi. Transfer Certificate & Migration Certificate from the Board/Institute/College/University last attended. If unavailable, Declaration to be submitted. Format is provided in ANNEXURE-F.
- vii. Candidates claiming reservation in the EWS Category are to submit certificate in the prescribed format given in ANNEXURE – H.

10.5 Failure to Submit Mandatory Documents: Candidates who fail to submit the mandatory documents mentioned in **point no. 10.4** by the stipulated date, even after securing a position in the merit list among the provisionally selected candidates, shall not be eligible for admission.

10.6 Payment of Tuition, Uniform & Hostel Fees: The selected candidates shall be required to pay the fee as mentioned in the fee structure for UG and PG students from ANNEXURE – I to L respectively. In case any selected candidate fails to deposit the fee within the stipulated period, his/her admission shall stand cancelled and candidates from the Waiting List shall be admitted through counselling.

10.7 Ragging:

- a. Ragging of any kind is strictly prohibited/banned in the University campus as per the government orders and existing laws. Anybody found indulging in ragging, will be strictly dealt with as per the existing laws.
- b. As per the UGC Regulation on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions 2009, as amended from time to time, all the students enrolled in various courses must register for undertaking at <https://antiragging.in/>, download and submit the undertaking document to the University.

Note: The students should submit relevant documents after enrolment to the University.

10.8 Sports Equipment

All students are required to procure personal sport equipment as specified for various games/sports, on their own.

10.9 Clothing and Other Requirements

The summer temperature at Imphal, Manipur ranges from 32°C to 38°C, and from 1°C to 2°C in winter. The students are advised to bring appropriate clothing and bedding. The students are advised to bring one black formal pant and one white formal shirt and one white collar T shirt and black track pants.

ADMISSION TEST (2023-24) PHYSICAL FITNESS TEST GUIDELINE**50 METER DASH**

Sprint or speed tests can be performed over varying distances, depending on the factors being tested and their relevance to the sport.

Purpose:

This test measure determines acceleration and speed.

Equipment:

Flat and clear surface of at least 70 meters.

Procedure:

This test involves running a single maximum sprint over 50 meters, with the time recorded. Start from a stationary standing position (hands cannot touch the ground), with one foot in front of the other. The front foot must be behind the starting line. Once the subject is ready and motionless, the starter gives the instructions "set" then "go.". The tester should provide hints for maximizing speed (such as keeping low, and driving hard with the arms and legs) and the participant should be encouraged to not slow down before crossing the finish line.

Scoring:

The total time taken to complete the distance is recorded, to the nearest one-tenth of a second.

STANDING LONG JUMP TEST (BROAD JUMP)

The Standing long jump also called the Broad Jump, is a common and easy to administer test of explosive leg power.

Purpose:

This test measures the explosive power of the legs.

Equipment:

Tape measure to measure distance jumped, non-slip floor for takeoff, and soft-landing area preferred. The take-off line should be marked.

Procedure:

The candidate stands behind a line marked on the ground with feet slightly apart. A two-foot take-off and landing are used, with the swinging of the arms and bending of the knees to provide forward drive. The subject attempts to jump as far as possible, landing on both feet without falling backward. Three attempts are allowed.

Scoring:

The measurement is taken from the take-off line to the nearest point of contact on the landing (back of the heels). Record the longest distance jumped, the best of three attempts, in meters and centimeters.

OVERHEAD POWER BALL THROW (BACKWARD)

The test involves throwing a medicine ball for maximum distance.

Purpose:

This test measures core strength and total body power.

Equipment:

2 and 3 kg Medicine ball (3kg for boys and 2 kg for girls).

Procedure:

The candidate starts by standing facing away from the direction they are going to throw, with their heels at the start line. The starting position is with the ball in both hands, held above the head, with arms extended. Keeping the arms extended, swing the ball down between your legs while flexing the knees. Then in one motion, the ball is flung up and back over the head. The athlete is permitted to fall backward over the line after the ball is released. Three attempts are allowed.

Scoring:

The distance from the starting line to where the ball first lands are recorded. The best result of three throws is recorded to the nearest, in meters and centimeters.

1000 METER RUN/WALK TEST

The 1 km (1000 mtrs) run test for males and females is one of the fitness tests used to measure cardiovascular endurance.

Purpose:

This test measures aerobic fitness.

Equipment:

Oval or running track.

Procedure:

This test aims to complete the required distance in the fastest possible time. On the signal, “ready,” all participants line up behind the starting line. On the command ‘Go!’ the clock will start, and they will begin running at their own pace. Cheering or calling out the elapsed time is also permitted to encourage the participants. Walking is permitted but not encouraged.

Scoring:

The total time taken to complete the distance is recorded, in minutes and seconds.
